Objectives and Investment Policy

The Fund's objective is to generate capital growth and income over the long term.

The objective is achieved mainly through investing in global equities and fixed income securities. Such exposure will primarily be taken indirectly through investment in collective investment schemes, which are eligible for investment by the Fund in accordance with Central Bank requirements. The Fund will invest a minimum of 50%, and may invest up to 100% of net assets, in open ended collective investment schemes in order to gain exposure to such global equities and fixed income securities.

The Fund will seek on an annual basis to outperform on a combined basis 60% of the MSCI AC World TR Index and 40% of the Barclays Global Aggregate Index (the "Combined Benchmark").

Exposure to equities may be taken directly or indirectly via collective investment schemes (subject to a limit of 50% in the case of direct equity investments). Equity and equity related securities to which the Fund may have exposure include, but are not limited to, preferred stocks and depository receipts (American Depositary Receipts and Global Depositary Receipts) for such securities, which are listed or traded on recognised exchanges in the United States, the United Kingdom, developed European and developed Asian markets.

The Fund may invest up to 60% of net assets (indirectly via collective investment schemes) in debt and debt-related securities (including emerging market sovereign and corporate debt, government bonds and/or corporate bonds which may have fixed or floating rates of interest and 90% of which will have a credit rating of investment grade or higher by Standard and Poor's, Moody's Investors Service or Fitch Ratings Ltd.) listed or traded on a recognised exchange.

Where market conditions require a defensive strategy or pending reinvestment, the Fund may also hold ancillary liquid assets including **Risk and Reward Profile of the Fund**

The risk indicator is determined using historical data or, where historical data is not available, using simulated historical data. The Fund is considered to be actively managed in reference to the Combined Benchmark by virtue of the fact that it seeks to outperform the Combined Benchmark.

Any income arising from the Fund will be reinvested and it is not intended that the Fund will pay dividends.

The Fund is suitable for investors who have a medium risk profile and who wish to capture capital growth and income over the long term. It is suitable for investors with at least a basic knowledge of and / or experience with financial products and that can bear financial losses (up to the total loss of the invested amount) and attach no importance to capital guarantees.


