The Sub-Fund is authorised in Ireland and regulated by The Central Bank of Ireland. What is this product?

Type

This product is a type of open-ended collective investment scheme, specifically, a sub-fund of the CCF which is an umbrella common contractual fund with segregated liability between sub-funds. This product is authorised by the Central Bank as a UCITS pursuant to the UCITS Regulations. Your investment will take the form of units in the Sub-Fund.

Objectives

Term The Sub-Fund does not have a maturity date. The Manager is not entitled to terminate the Sub-Fund unilaterally. Termination of the Sub-Fund is only possible in those cases expressly provided for in the Prospectus or the Supplement of the Sub-Fund.

Investment objective The Sub-Fund's goal is to achieve growth of the Sub-Fund's value in the medium to long term and to outperform the MSCI World Developed Index (the "Benchmark").

The Sub-Fund promotes environmental characteristics and as such is a financial product referred to in Article 8 of the Sustainable Finance Disclosures Regulation.

Investment Policies The Sub-Fund invests in shares of large companies, which may be located in developed countries worldwide, excluding those directly involved within the fossil fuels industry.

The Investment Manager selects stocks of companies using the Osmosis Model of Resource Efficiency (the "MoRE Model"). The MoRE Model has been developed by the Investment Manager to rate companies on resource efficiency by compiling information on energy, waste and water. The Sub-Fund has a global investment strategy, with no particular target in relation to any industrial, geographic or other market sectors.

The Sub-Fund may also invest up to 10% of its net asset value in cash equivalents and money market instruments. The Sub-Fund may also invest up to 10% of its net asset value in collective investment schemes.

The Sub-Fund may use Financial Derivatives for investment

purposes and efficient portfolio management, including hedging.

The Sub-Fund's base currency is US dollars. The class currency for this Unit Class is USD.

Portfolio transaction costs may have an impact on the Sub-Fund's performance. Portfolio transaction costs are paid out of the assets of the Sub-Fund, in addition to the charges set out below.

This Sub-Fund is actively managed in reference to the Benchmark by virtue of the fact that the investment objective of the Sub-Fund is to outperform the Benchmark. The Investment Manager has discretion to invest in securities not included in the Benchmark at any time in order to take advantage of investment opportunities. The investment strategy will restrict the extent to which the Sub-Fund's holdings may deviate from the Benchmark. This deviation may be material.

Benchmark The benchmark of this sub-fund is MSCI World Developed Index.

Redemption and Dealing You can buy, redeem and/or exchange units on each business day on which banks in Ireland and England are generally open for business provided that all the required documentation has been furnished and received by the Administrator.

Distribution policy There are no distributions.

Intended retail investor

The Sub-Fund is intended for informed investors that seek capital appreciation through broad based global equity exposure and are willing to accept a medium level of risk and a medium to long investment horizon.

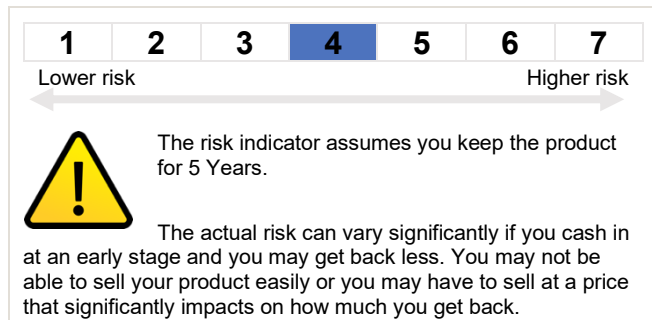

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the

What happens if Osmosis Investment Management UK Limited is unable to pay out?

If we are not able to pay you out what we owe you, you are not covered by any national compensation scheme. To protect you, the assets are held with a separate company, a depository. Should we default, the depository would liquidate the investments and distribute the proceeds to the investors. In worst case, however, you would lose your entire investment.

What are the costs?
